## GREETING

In the name of the Father,  
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you  
**and also with you.**

*From Easter Day to Pentecost this acclamation follows*

Alleluia. Christ is risen.  
**He is risen indeed. Alleluia.**

## PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

*These responses are used with penitential sentences:*

Lord have mercy  
**Lord have mercy**

Christ have mercy  
**Christ have mercy**

Lord have mercy  
**Lord have mercy**

*The absolution is given*

## GLORIA

*used on Sundays and festivals only*

**Glory to God in the highest,  
and peace to his people on earth.  
Lord God, heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship you, we give you thanks,  
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,  
Lord God, Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world:  
have mercy on us;  
you are seated at the right hand  
of the Father: receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,  
with the Holy Spirit,  
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

**Thanks be to God**

## GOSPEL READING

The Lord be with you  
**And also with you**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ  
according to *N*  
**Glory to you, O Lord**

*At the end:*

This is the Gospel of the Lord  
**Praise to you, O Christ**

Lord, in your mercy

## PEACE

The peace of the Lord be always with you  
**And also with you**

## OFFERTORY

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation  
through your goodness we have this bread to offer,  
which earth has given and human hands have made.  
It will become for us the bread of life  
**Blessed be God for ever.**

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation  
through your goodness we have this wine to offer,  
fruit of the vine and work of human hands.  
It will become for us the cup of salvation  
**Blessed be God for ever.**

## **EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER**

**It is right to give thanks and praise**

*The priest thanks God for his gifts and all respond:*

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,**

**God of power and might,**

**heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

**Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is he who comes**

**in the name of the Lord.**

**Hosanna in the highest.**

*The president recalls the Last Supper, and one of these four acclamations may be used*

Great is the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died. Christ is risen.**

**Christ will come again.**

Praise to you, Lord Jesus:

**Dying you destroyed our death;**

**rising you restored our life:**

**Lord Jesus, come in glory.**

Christ is the bread of life:

**When we eat this bread and drink this cup,**

**we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus,**

**until you come in glory**

Jesus Christ is Lord:

**Lord, by your cross and resurrection**

**you have set us free.**

**You are the Saviour of the world.**

*The Prayer continues and finishes either:*

**Blessing and honour and glory and power,**

**be yours for ever and ever. Amen.**

*Or*

**Amen.**

## **THE LORD'S PRAYER**

**Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,**

**your kingdom come,**

**your will be done, on earth as in heaven.**

**Give us today our daily bread.**

**Forgive us our sins**

**as we forgive those who sin against us.**

**Lead us not into temptation**

**but deliver us from evil.**

**For the kingdom, the power, and the glory**

**are yours, now and for ever. Amen.**

## **BREAKING THE BREAD**

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ

**Though we are many, we are one body,**

**because we all share in one bread**

*Or*

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup,

**we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.**

## **AGNUS DEI**

**Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us peace.**

## **COMMUNION**

Jesus is the Lamb of God

who takes away the sin of the world.

Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,**

**but only say the word, and I shall be healed.**

*or*

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.

**Jesus Christ is holy, Jesus Christ is Lord,**

**to the glory of God the Father.**

*or from Easter Day to Pentecost*

Alleluia. Christ our passover is sacrificed for us.

**Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.**

The body and blood of Christ. **Amen**

*Communion is given in silence*

*A special prayer for the day*

## **BLESSING**

... and the blessing of God Almighty,

the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,

be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

## **DISMISSAL**

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord

**In the name of Christ. Amen.**

*or from Easter Day to Pentecost*

Go in the peace of Christ. Alleluia. Alleluia

**Thanks be to God. Alleluia. Alleluia.**
