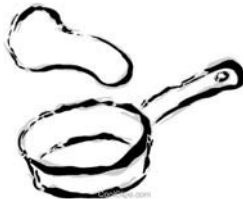


LENT

Grant instead to me your servant the spirit of purity and humility and the spirit of patience and love.
